2022 was a year characterized with numerous activities dedicated to Youth. From the EU level, with the announcement of 2022 European Year of Youth, to the Tirana European Youth Capital - a vibrant dynamic for the WB6; youth became a keyword in the political sphere across the region. On a more tangible aspect, young people were given several opportunities to address long-present challenges such as unemployment, brain drain, lack of quality education through several EU and region-led initiatives. The year saw the start of the accession talks with Albania and North-Macedonia, the granting of the candidate status to Bosnia and Herzegovina and the relaunch of the Berlin Process with the signature of important agreements impacting youth mobility and education. A reinforced Youth Guarantee under a large EU investment plan for the region aims to provide young people with further employment and education opportunities.

Increase of investments in human capital development is key to address brain drain and youth migration and to building well-governed institutions in the region. In its 7th edition of EUSAIR Ministerial in May 2022, the Tirana Declaration was adopted, acknowledging the need to empower youth as key driver of regional cooperation, reconciliation and peacebuilding, and emphasizing that the inclusion of young people in the decision-making process requires an all-inclusive approach, encompassing all stakeholders of the Adriatic Ionian region, including social and non-governmental actors, media and business community.

What better opportunity like the imminent launch of the new IPA INTERREG programmes 2021-2027 for testing those commitments and co-creating the impact of the new era of European Cooperation programmes 2021-2027?

The "Manifesto for Young People by Young People to Shape the European Cooperation Policy" underlines that improving young people's skills and boosting employment are in fact the key challenges for youth. And, as we come closer to the end of the European Year of Youth 2022 and Tirana European Youth Capital 2022, and welcome the announced 2023 Year of Skills, there is a positive momentum to use to capitalize on youth impact within main cohesion-led instruments and initiatives that come to the region. As iterated in the Tirana Connectivity Forum '22 "youth should be shapers of EU policies and programs and not only their beneficiaries".

As part of the promotion initiative of Youth Manifesto recommendations and the upcoming launch of INTERREG IPA programmes, through this joint conference organized in cooperation with Tirana European Youth Capital 2022, CDI aims to bring together youth and youth







stakeholders under the general objective of promoting EU territorial cooperation initiatives as drivers of empowerment and development opportunities for youth.
